Deark Hamjan,

I regret that there has been such a delay in replying to your letter of the IJth.April about the acceptance of the Jamia Urdu certificates for appointment of Urdu teachers in our primary schools. As the Jamia Urdu Examinations are being held in Mauritius by a private asency, my Ministry was not aware of the syllabuses and could not therefore equate ther. But we have on receipt of your letter made enquities—hence the delay in replying to your letter—and I am glad to inform you that I agree to the acceptance of the Jamia Urdu certificate Ibtidai as equivalent to a pass in Urdu either at the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary)or in the School vertificate. We would, of course, require from candidates to the posts of Urdu teachers passes in two other subjects at the General Certificate of Education examination or three other subjects at the Cambridge School Certificate examination, as we have done in the case of hindi teachers.
